

oday's meeting the Girls will be completing the earning of their Girl Scout "Be a Sister to Every Girl Scout" petal ("Vi" the Violet petal) which represents the last statement in the Girl Scout Law. The Girls began earning this petal when they learned about and participated in the various "World Thinking Day"



activities (creating the poster board about Switzerland and attending the Plum Girl Scout Service Unit (SU) "World Thinking Day – 2014" event held on Saturday, February 22nd).

This month the Girl Scouts of the Murrysville SU are hosting a S.W.A.P. Convention event on Friday, April 11th at Franklin Regional Middle School. Two of our Troop's Girls (and their Moms & Leader) will be attending this wonderful event. So, during today's meeting, the Girls will be learning about the Girl Scout tradition of S.W.A.P.s and will be *helping* to make several (approx. 150) S.W.A.P.s to "Be a Sister" to Laurel and Ande *in support* of these two Girls attending the special event to represent our Troop. After today's meeting, all Girls will have two different S.W.A.P.s to keep for themselves to commemorate their learning about this tradition for the first time. Also, our three Girls (Annalyn, Evelyn, & Kaia) who will be "Bridging to Brownies" in a couple of months, will get to have two additional S.W.A.P.s to take home and share with another Girl of the same age. When they do this, they will be able to tell about all they have been doing in Girl Scouts and maybe they will invite them to join the troop for next year. This little Girl Scout "assignment" will allow them to fulfill the first requirement of their "Bridging to Brownies" Award.

What is a S.W.A.P.? The acronym stands for Special Whatamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere or Share With A Pal. The origin of S.W.A.P.s is Native American. Potlatch is the ceremonial exchange of gifts practiced by Native Americans of Northwest Coastal tribes.

The custom stems from the legend explaining why birds have colored feathers. As the story goes, two Indian girls plucked feathers of a magic bird and distributed the multicolored plumage to the colorless birds living in the forest. From that time on, birds have had brightly colored feathers and those gifts were remembered at Potlatch ceremonies. Families were summoned to the Potlatch by a messenger carrying a bundle of sticks representing the number of people to be invited. The ceremony included speeches. songs, dances, games, races and refreshments. The host and members of his family were costumed and enacted legends about their heritage. The gift giving came last of all, just before the guests departed. Since Potlatch gifts were symbols of the family's status in the village, they were often quite elaborate, often being carved boxes, canoes, dishes, jewelry, mats and baskets. The Potlatch ceremony was given to commemorate the births, deaths. marriages, or coming of age of members of the group.

The idea of S.W.A.P.s was started at the original National Roundup Conferences. At that time a S.W.A.P. was a little remembrance that one Scout gave another. S.W.A.P.s are handmade, thus the girl is giving a part of herself to show friendship. Swaps are exchanged at National Conventions, Council events, Wider Ops, SU or neighborhood events, troop meetings and most frequently at day camp. They can have a tag attached with the event name and date or the Troop number, Council name or State. In some countries SWAPS are called "hat crafts".

Swapping *promotes friendship* and *encourages girls to talk to other girls*. S.W.A.P.s are great mementos of a good time as well as a great way to share something about where we live and what we do.
