oday is *Girl Scouting's Birthday!* On this day in 1912, Juliette "*Daisy*" Gordon Low assembled and registered a group of 18 girls from Savannah, Georgia for the first ever Girl Scout meeting. It all started with a phone call on March 12, 1912 . . . "I've got



something for the girls of Savannah, and all America, and all the world. . ." Juliette was off and going with the first Girl Scout troop. By 1916, membership had expanded to 5,000, uniforms had gone from homemade blue to ready-made khaki, and a Girl Scout handbook had been published. Soon there

were local Girl Scout councils, a national training school for Girl Scout leaders, World War I service projects, the publication of a girls' magazine called The American Girl, and the first nationally franchised cookie sale. By era's end, membership was over 400,000. Today, over 3.2 million girls and adults are active Girl Scout members, and over 50 million women are Girl Scout alumnae. This year. 2015, represents our 103rd birthday! Juliette Low believed that all girls should have the opportunity to develop physically, mentally, and spiritually. She organized service projects, outdoor adventures, and enrichment programs to get girls out of the house and into the community. The Girl Scout Birthday, March 12th, is always included in the celebration of Girl Scout Week each March which starts with Girl Scout Sunday. According to the mission statement of the organization, Girl Scouting builds girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place. With the mission statement in mind, each day of the Girl Scout **Week** is structured to represent something different. **Girl** Scout Sunday & Girl Scout Sabbath give girls an opportunity to attend their place of worship and be recognized as Girl Scouts. If a place of worship is the group's sponsor, girls may perform a service, such as greeting, ushering, or doing a flag ceremony. These days can also be a time when girls explore to understand other faiths. Service to Family Monday gives girls the opportunity to give back to the people in their family or their home. Service to Community Tuesday gives girls the opportunity to give back to their school, church or any organization that helps our community. *Health and*

Safety Wednesday gives girls the opportunity to focus on learning how to incorporate healthy living, exercise, stress relief, nutrition and FUN into their everyday life.

International Friendship Day Thursday (and Girl Scouts Birthday) gives the girls an opportunity to learn how they can make a difference in our global community. Often girls will also begin a correspondence relationship with an international pen pal Girl Guide. Arts and Culture Friday focuses on games and learning through games. Also this day gives girls the opportunity to discover and experience Plays, museums, and/or concerts. Service to the Planet Saturday (and Girl Scout Sabbath) gives the girls the opportunity to learn how they can make a difference in their community through conservation and ecology.

In honor of Girl Scouting's Birthday, our Troop's meeting today will be a Birthday celebration of sorts and we will revisit the basic ideals of Girl Scouting and earning the official "The GS Way patch" today!



After today, the Girls only have 5 more Troop meeting days remaining. There are also many upcoming activities and events taking place during this 2nd half of the Girl Scout year! Please, be sure to take note of them (& their due dates) listed on the next three pages and mark your calendars, as this is the time of the Girl Scout Year that things get a little crazy-busy!

We will also be rescheduling the Troop's visit to Concordia Personal Care Home (Renton Road) that was originally scheduled for February 14th to a date in May. At the February 5th meeting, we gave our three Brownies (Annalyn, Kaia, & Hailey) some badge work to complete at home by the end of March. Please, be sure to hand those in by the April 2nd meeting.
